WHAT'S NEW WITH BCFP

Since the start of the new fiscal year in July, Mark has officially retired (but is still serving on our state Association of Farmland Protection) and Resa has taken the reins as Executive Director. We closed on an Easement in August that had been in the works for two years. In September and October, we closed on two more Easements. Berkeley County Farmland Protection is now preserving over 8,500 acres! Rebecca, our Stewardship Coordinator, has been working hard monitoring our fall schedule of properties and updating all of our GIS features. We had a fun time supporting the youth at the Berkeley

County Youth Fair, and have also been trying to up our social media focus - be sure to follow us on Facebook and Instagram! We have two more easement projects that we hope to close either late this calendar year or early in the Winter, from this past year's cycle. Our application window closed at the end of October for fiscal year 2024, and we had so many beautiful properties apply. We wish that we could fund them all!
